Dymo Label Printer Maintenance

Dymo label printers are very popular among our clients. Dymo offers a great product that prints very high quality labels, takes up little space, requires no ink or toner, and requires **very little** maintenance. However, Dymo printers do require some maintenance to keep them running smoothly.

Clean the printer on a regular basis. The main recommendation is to keep your printer as clean as possible. There are two basic methods to do this.

Dymo offers special cleaning cards that can be run through the printer to keep it clean. These cards are moistened with a cleaning solution to keep the print head and label path clean. It is recommended that you run the card through 2-3 times each time you change a label roll. Cleaning cards are inexpensive and available from VETECH or from Dymo directly.

It is also a good idea to use a can of compressed air to clean the printer. This is also a very handy tool for other printers, and other computer components. This will clear out dust, hair, etc. from the printer that can cause trouble. Remove any labels, and use the small straw nozzle and blow air directly into the label path. Following just these simple steps will improve print quality and extend the life of your Dymo label printer.
